The questions were presented individually on separate pages. The options were randomized for the questions where the order is not meaningful.

Block 3: Elicitation of prior beliefs

Now we will ask you whether you think a given characteristic is determined by biological factors vs other factors (e.g. education, environment, upbringing etc).

People may have different opinions about these questions. We are only interested in your personal views and preferences.

To choose weights for factors (biological factors vs other factors), please move the slider. Once you move it, you will see percentages displayed on it. Please notice that all ranges of the weights can be chosen (from 0 to 100%): [a slider for short practice]

Block 5: Treatment (Information group only)

Now we will ask you to read the following scientific text:

Researchers have been asking whether different traits are predetermined by some factor or not. For example, many scientists investigate whether genetics, hormones, brain structure or birth order affect the probability of having a homosexual sexual orientation. Professor Ray Blanchard (University of Toronto) found that the more older brothers a man has, the greater the probability is that he will have a homosexual sexual orientation. This is known as the "older brother effect". According to these studies, the odds of being gay increase from 2 percent for the 1st son to 6 percent for the 5th son. Thus, there is a threefold increase. These findings have later been replicated by other researchers and they suggest that sexual orientation has biological roots.

Block 6: Allocation tasks

You will now be asked to participate in five money allocation tasks.

In each one of these tasks, you will be endowed with 500 RUB and will be asked to allocate this money between two individuals. Let's call them recipients. The recipients will appear on the left and right sides of the screen and will be changed in each task.

Your allocation choices will not affect your payment, but they may be decisive for the recipients.

After all participants complete the survey, 20 participants will be randomly selected and one of their choices will be randomly chosen to be implemented. In each of these tasks, you will be provided with information about the individuals that are involved prior to making your decisions. All individuals have similar level of income. Please also note that none of the individuals will learn your identity.

Allocation task 1: male same-sex profile vs male different-sex profile

Allocation task 2: female same-sex profile vs female different-sex profile

Allocation task 3: male different-sex profile vs male different-sex profile

Allocation task 4: female different-sex profile vs female different-sex profile

Allocation task 5: male different-sex profile vs female different-sex profile

Block 7: Personality traits

You now will be asked to consider 4 individuals and will be provided information about them. Please read the information attentively.

We will ask your opinion on the extent a given trait can be attributed to a given individual. [page break]

Participants were presented with 4 same-sex profiles and were asked the question, "To what extent can the given trait be attributed to this person?". The traits were: creative, reliable, hard-working, family-oriented, career-oriented, persistent, open to a new experience, emotionally stable, risk-lover. The traits were collectively presented on the same page and in random order. The profiles were displayed to participants individually on separate pages and in random order.

Block 8: Policy support

Now we will ask a few questions about your opinion on different policies. [page break]

Do you think abortion should be legal under any circumstances, legal only under certain circumstances or illegal in all circumstances? - Legal under any circumstances, - Legal only under certain circumstances, - Illegal in all circumstances

To what extent do you agree with the following statement? "If a woman does not want to have children, she should have the right to have an abortion." - Disagree, - Somewhat disagree, - Neutral, - Somewhat agree, - Agree, - Hard to answer

To what extent do you think it should be legal for same-sex couples to adopt a child, with the same rights as traditional couples? Should be legal: - Disagree, - Somewhat disagree, - Neutral, - Somewhat agree, - Agree

Do you think same-sex marriages should be recognized by law as valid, with the same rights as traditional marriages? Should be recognized: - Disagree, - Somewhat disagree, - Neutral, - Somewhat agree, - Agree

To what extent is the following statement justifiable? "Cheating on taxes if you have a chance." (*slider*) 1 - never justifiable, 7 - always justifiable

To what extent do you agree with the following statements? Men may use violence to keep their wives in line. A man should use violence to get respect if necessary. Parents may use violence or threats when bringing up their children. A woman should tolerate violence to keep the family together. No-one else should interfere when it comes to violence within a family. - Disagree, - Somewhat disagree, - Neutral, - Somewhat agree, - Agree

The statements were collectively presented on the same page and in random order.

The questions in this block were presented individually on separate pages and in random order.

Block 9: Elicitation of posterior beliefs (Information group only)

Now we will ask your opinion on the influence of biological factors on the given traits.

Please move the slider to choose the weights: 0% - biological factors play no role, 100% - the given trait is completely predetermined by biological factors.

Creativity, Sexual orientation, Musical abilities, Cognitive abilities. [a slider for each trait] The traits were collectively presented on the same page and in random order.

Block 10: Post-experiment questions

In this section, you will be asked the last few questions of this survey. Please read them carefully and respond as truthfully as possible. Remember that your answers are completely anonymous.

Which of these describes you more accurately? - Liberal, - Conservative, - Apolitical, - Other (type), - Hard to answer. The first three options were presented in random order.

What is your experience in online survey participation? Please choose the amount of online

surveys you have participated in. - 0, - 1, ... -10, - more than 10

What do you think the survey was about? (type) This is an open-ended question, with a maximum character limit of 40.

Do you know any homosexual person (as a colleague, friend, family member, other)? - Yes, - No, - Hard to say. *The first two options were presented in random order.*
